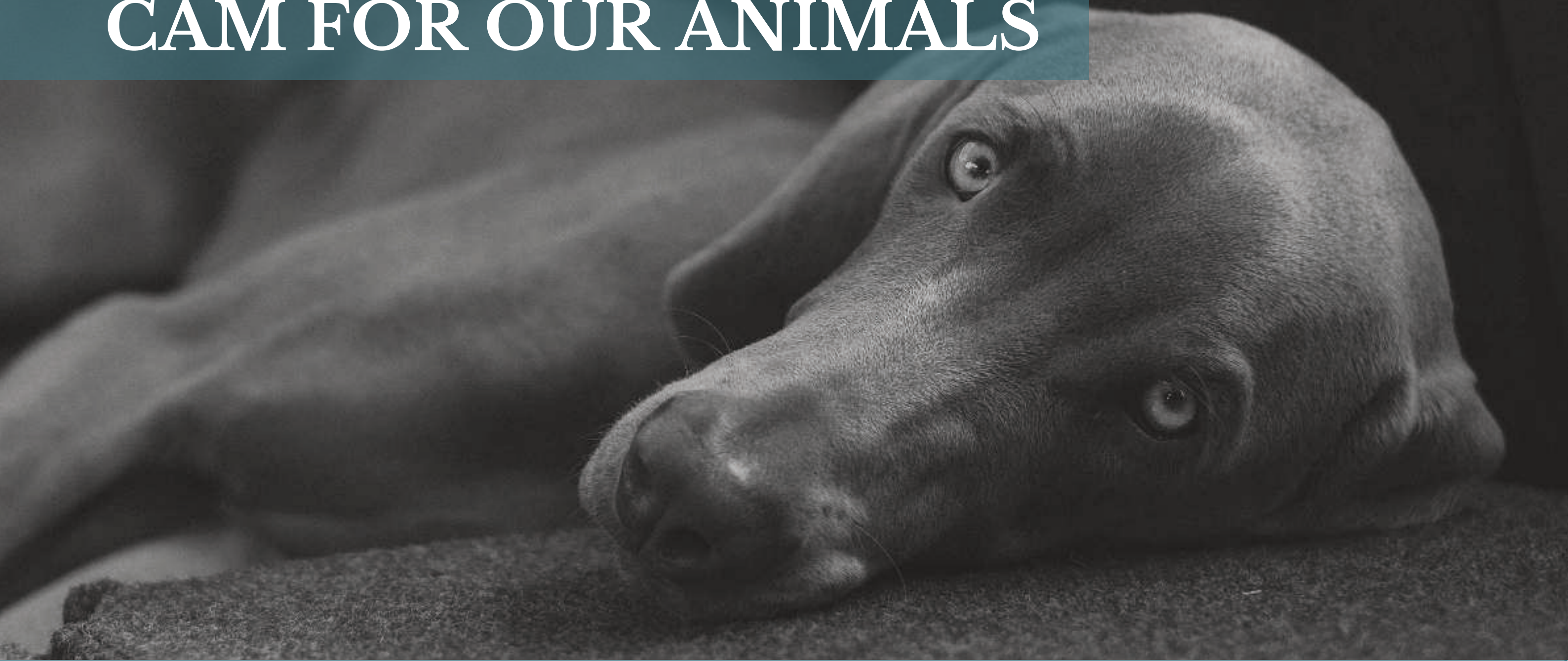


FREEDOM TO CHOOSE CAM FOR OUR ANIMALS

The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons' Council statement now restricts our vets to using CAM after, or in combination with drugs, never as a first-choice.
